## **Sharp Scholarship Fund**

#### Purpose:

The purpose of the Sharp Scholarship Fund shall be to further the education of students by awarding scholarships to Wilmington Area School District students.

Mr. and Mrs. Sharp were lifetime residents of the Borough of New Wilmington, owning and operating the Sharp Funeral Home, now known as the Smith Funeral Home. They had no children of their own but wanted to assist students from the local school district.

This scholarship award shall be awarded only to Wilmington Area School District seniors or graduates.

The Scholarship is awarded for one year and may be renewed up to three additional years. A new application must be submitted each year for consideration.

The scholarship awarded hereunder shall be given to students with consideration to need, aptitude, and achievement.

Because the Sharp Scholarship Fund can make distribution only for tuition and related expenses, the invoice must include all costs, tuition, scholarships, and loans		

If you change school between terms, a new application must be completed.

If your parents are separated or divorced, you must explain the financial support given to you by both parents. If you are a separated or divorced person, you must submit documentation of the financial support given to you by your spouse or former spouse.

If you receive a grant, it will be designated for the entire school year. The grant will be divided into two terms, one-half will be paid for the fall term; and, if you qualify academically, a like amount will be paid for the spring term. In order to qualify for the spring term, a transcript of your first term grades and an invoice for the spring semester must be submitted to the Sharp Scholarship Fund. Your transcript will be reviewed, and a determination as to your eligibility for the second term will be made.
